A member of the public wishing to speak on more than one agenda item at a single meeting shall limit his or her remarks to a total of five (5) minutes per meeting.

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



Agenda Item 22-0025 - Discussion and possible action regarding a letter to Councilmember John Lee and the Board of Engineering in opposition to a proposal for restrooms and shade structures within Lazy J and Castle Peak Parks

At the request of CD12, the WHNC Zoning & Planning committee has been working with CD12 since October 2021 to get the opinion of West Hills constituents regarding a proposal to install restroom facilities to both Lazy J and Castle Peak Parks.

At the October 12, 2021, Zoning committee meeting, opposition to the proposal was presented to the committee by a vast majority of those in attendance. The committee voted to oppose with 9 yes, 0 no, 3 abstentions and 2 absent. The results of this meeting were given to CD12.

Currently, a panel consisting of WHNC board members, Tony Scearce, Clarice Chavira, Dr. Faye Barta, Aida Abkarians and Char Rothstein have been appointed to the Local Voluntary Neighborhood Oversight Committee (LVNOC) to advise the city on the Lazy J and castle Peak Parks improvements. A first meeting was held on February 24, 2022, with two future meetings to follow. Those in attendance spoke mainly against the proposals and the committee voted 5 in opposition, 1 in favor and 1 absent.

The WHNC has received numerous emails, phone calls and petitions are currently in circulation in opposition to the proposals. A letter has been requested by CD12 for a status update.

Agenda Item 22-0032 - Discussion and possible action on requesting that John Lee, CD12 allocate at least \$100,000 from his office's discretionary funds to pay police overtime to support specialized enforcement against street racing and speeding in West Hills and his district

Dear Councilmember Lee:

One of the primary goals of the West Hills Neighborhood Council (WHNC) is to protect its stakeholders from crime, danger and other problems common to modern cities and towns.

For some time now, West Hills has been plagued by street racing and speeding day and night. Stakeholders have lost loved ones to cars travelling three times the speed limit and screeching in turns and wheelies in usually quiet neighborhoods, both day and night. Because people are dying and quality of life has been and continues to be greatly affected, continuation of these reckless acts is totally unacceptable.

At this time greater enforcement of existing traffic laws is absolutely necessary. In order to accomplish greater enforcement, the people who are causing these traffic issues need to be held accountable and arrested for speeding and street racing.

A major hindrance to enforcing our current traffic laws is the lack of specialized enforcement by the LAPD. To correct that lack, it is necessary to allocate funds to support overtime costs for specialized enforcement by the LAPD to target areas of organized racing and speeding.

The WHNC therefore requests that at least \$100,000 from your office's discretionary funds be earmarked and immediately used to pay for police overtime to support specialized enforcement against street racing and speeding in West Hills. In addition some of the tools developed to deter speeding and street racing could also be added to further assist LAPD in removing these street racers from our neighborhood streets.

There are major streets in West Hills that are misused for street racing and speeding ...Valley Circle Blvd., Roscoe Blvd., Fallbrook Ave., Shoup Ave., Victory Blvd., Vanowen Blvd., to name just a few.

Please expedite the funding we have requested forthwith so that future deaths and destruction are avoided.

Thank you in advance for your anticipated PROMPT action to activate this necessary crusade against speeding and street racing.

One of the mandates of the Board of Directors of the West Hills Neighborhood Council (WHNC) is to promote the interests and concerns of its stakeholders and to assist stakeholders by safeguarding their well-being and safety.

Our children are our most vulnerable stakeholders of our community. Annually more children die from traumatic injury than all other causes/diseases combined. Many of these preventable injuries are from car crashes and pedestrian injuries. Children rely on us to help keep them safe.

Local concerned parents, residents and stakeholders have alerted us to the ongoing problems with speeding and reckless driving at Welby Way Charter Elementary School. Specifically, along Lederer Ave and at the intersection of Lederer Ave and Kittridge St. These issues are most severe during pickup and drop off, but all times of the day and night speeding is an issue along Lederer Ave. It is only a matter of time, before one of our children, our most vulnerable stakeholders, become a statistic.

The West Hills Neighborhood Council requests the City install three "Speed Tables" on Lederer Ave. to mitigate these ongoing problems of excessive speed and reckless driving.
