



At the request of CD12, the WHNC Zoning & Planning committee has been working with CD12 since October 2021 to get the opinion of West Hills constituents regarding a proposal to install restroom facilities to both Lazy J and Castle Peak Parks.

At the October 12, 2021, Zoning committee meeting, opposition to the proposal was presented to the committee by a vast majority of those in attendance. The committee voted to oppose with 9 yes, 0 no, 3 abstentions and 2 absent. The results of this meeting were given to CD12.

Currently, a panel consisting of WHNC board members, Tony Scearce, Clarice Chavira, Dr. Faye Barta, Aida Abkarians and Char Rothstein have been appointed to the Local Voluntary Neighborhood Oversight Committee (LVNOC) to advise the city on the Lazy J and castle Peak Parks improvements. A first meeting was held on February 24, 2022, with two future meetings to follow. Dear Councilmember Lee:

One of the primary goals of the West Hills Neighborhood Council (WHNC) is to protect its stakeholders from crime, danger and other problems common to modern cities and towns.

For some time now, West Hills has been plagued by street racing and speeding day and night. Stakeholders have lost loved ones to cars travelling three times the speed limit and screeching in turns and wheelies in usually quiet neighborhoods, both day and night. Because people are dying and quality of life has been and continues to be greatly affected, continuation of these reckless acts is totally unacceptable.

At this time greater enforcement of existing traffic laws is absolutely necessary. In order to accomplish greater enforcement, the people who are causing these traffic issues need to be held accountable and arrested for speeding and street racing.

A major hindrance to enforcing our current traffic laws is the lack of specialized enforcement by the LAPD. To correct that lack, it is necessary to allocate funds to support overtime costs for specialized enforcement by the LAPD to target areas of organized racing and speeding.

The WHNC therefore requests that at least \$100,000 from your office's discretionary funds be earmarked and immediately used to pay for police overtime to support specialized enforcement against street racing and speeding in West Hills. In addition some of the tools developed to deter speeding and street racing could also be added to further assist LAPD in removing these street racers from our neighborhood streets.

Local concerned parents, residents and stakeholders have alerted us to the ongoing problems with speeding and reckless driving at Welby Way Charter Elementary School. Specifically, along Lederer Ave and at the intersection of Lederer Ave and Kittridge St. These issues are most severe during pickup and drop off, but all times of the day and night speeding is an issue along Lederer Ave. It is only a matter of time, before one of our children, our most vulnerable stakeholders, become a statistic.
