Department of Neighborhood Empowerment: John Darnell, Neighborhood Empowerment Advocate said the Congress of Neighborhoods is on Saturday, September 24, 2022 via Zoom and registration opens August 27, 2022. He also said legislative updates are back and will be mailed out. They can also be found in the monthly profile. Civic University 1.0 is also back and he asked that an item be placed on the agenda for the next meeting to appoint members from the WHNC.

Los Angeles County Supervisor District 3 LAUSD District 3, Blake Clayton, West Valley/Mt. Communities Field Deputy & Caseworker, said the County has monkeypox information available at phlacounty.gov/monkeypox. Covid numbers are steadily increasing. The indoor mask mandate was not approved. Discretionary funds are available until November 1, 2022 for 501c3s; apply at SupervisorKuehl.com/grants. The County Council is working with Ventura County on the Santa Susana Field Laboratory cleanup.

Dan Brin moved to strike the paragraph:

We view this failure in the context of a long history of snubs to our community's identity and integrity. For example, we have witnessed the spectacle of another Neighborhood Council granting "approval" of the LAFD helicopter facility in the Nature Preserve without even informing the department that the project was in West Hills. As a result, the residents of the affected area, all of them West Hills residents, were denied representation in a decision that directly concerned them.

Steve Randall said a Specific Plan covers the area and takes precedence over the Community Plan. Anthony Scearce said his request to have this item postponed was ignored. He also said the City Planning website explicitly says Community Plan boundaries do not correspond to Neighborhood Council boundaries, and he has a petition opposing the proposed change signed by ninety local residents. Bryan Newman said he would like to see the boundaries stay as they are. Joanne Yvanek-Garb said she has attended ten to twenty meetings on this since the subject came up three or four years ago. Myrl Schreibman said there is too much bickering over land neither Neighborhood Council has any control over. Reeyan Raynes said zoning codes ultimately determine use and a boundary change will not make much difference. Goat Puppet suggested delaying for further study.

Anthony Scearce moved to postpone a vote on this item to September. Bryan Newman seconded. Steve Randall said West Hills is split and should not be. Anthony Scearce said the petition asks to remove only a small portion of northwest West Hills, and not everything above Roscoe, from City Planning's proposal.

APPROVED LETTER RE WHNC RESPOND TO PROPOSED COMMUNITY PLAN MAP

Dear Mr. Bertoni:

The West Hills Neighborhood Council appreciates your efforts in updating the Community Plans for the western part of the San Fernando Valley. However, we are also concerned that those efforts have not gone far enough.

The proposed adjusted boundary of the Canoga Park-Winnetka-Woodland Hills-West Hills Community Plan only partially addresses our prior requests to recognize that West Hills' northern boundary is defined by the centerline of Nordhoff Street between Topanga Canyon Boulevard and the western edge of the City of Los Angeles.

Unfortunately, the map you drew ignores our request that this boundary line must follow the centerline of Nordhoff Street westward **through** the Nature Preserve, in accord with all official maps of the city's neighborhoods.

The attached map, which is in accord with the bylaws of the Chatsworth Neighborhood Council as well as the West Hills Neighborhood Council, clearly shows that **more than**75% of the Nature Preserve is in West Hills. Unfortunately, the Planning Department's proposed map would place the entire Nature Preserve under the jurisdiction of the Chatsworth-Porter Ranch Community Plan.

The West Hills Neighborhood Council objects to this proposed map, which would exclude the people of West Hills from one means of direct involvement in determining the future of a major portion of their neighborhood.


We view this failure in the context of a long history of snubs to our community's identity and integrity. For example, we have witnessed the spectacle of another Neighborhood Council granting "approval" of the LAFD helicopter facility in the Nature Preserve without even informing the department that the project was in West Hills. As a result, the residents of the affected area, all of them West Hills residents, were denied representation in a decision that directly concerned them.

The West Hills Neighborhood Council therefore urges you and the Department of City Planning to adjust your proposed map of the Canoga Park-Winnetka-Woodland Hills-

West Hills Community Plan so that it includes the portion of the Nature Preserve that is within West Hills' actual boundaries.

Agenda Item 22-0064 - Discussion and possible action on a proposed draft letter to LAHSA about the problems and shortcomings and solutions with the Homeless Count.

To: Ms. Kristina Dixon, Ms. Molly Rysman, Acting LAHSA Co-Executive Directors,

After close analysis and several discussions concerning the West Hills Neighborhood Council's volunteering each year to assist with the homeless count that LAHSA supports and ENCOURAGES, there are several issues to which we must have answers before we can recommend CONTINUED support from the WHNC in our community.

First and most importantly, we understand that LAHSA receives funding from the city and other sources to support this activity as well as provides remuneration to several of its helpers. In order to (PUT A SPACE HERE) provide full TRANSPARENC, we are requiring a financial statement of the homeless count for each of the last three years as well as an overall financial statement for LAHSA. Secondly, the organization for this count each January is very distressing, if not taxing, on the volunteers in our community since LAHSA only focuses on the count and not on the members volunteering for the count. Your organization and instructions for this event constantly PUT our volunteers in danger! There is no proper identification for the vehicles such as metallic signs for the vehicles; no proper forewarning to stakeholders as to what will be taking place; no protection for the volunteers who are asked to check parks, alleyways, washes and isolated areas that put volunteers at risk by (PUT A SPACE HERE) irritated and indignant unhoused people. Thirdly, LAHSA required organizers to return hand scribbled dashboard signs to Panorama City very late in the evening this last count, which for the sake of safety this last year, we refused to do. Finally we have discovered that other Neighborhood Councils have refused to contribute to this yearly activity and it falls to PAID employees of LAHSA to complete the task. Our Neighborhood Council has never been informed of this option.

Until LAHSA provides appropriate financial disclosures, SECURES an organization that puts the protection of the volunteers first as well as PROVIDES appropriate comfort for the volunteers and/orif need be,to provide a LAHSA STAFF member to assist, we and our Homeless Committee are unable (PUT A SPACE HERE) to recommend that in the future, we participate in the annual count for the West Hills Community. Working together with full transparency IS KEY to any successful important activity such as the homeless count.
