#### **Canine "Mystery" Respiratory Illness:** What should you know?

It is hard to turn on the news or any social media platform without getting bombarded with news of a mystery respiratory illness affecting dogs in the US. With the remnant of COVID and the recollection of the 2021 canine influenza outbreak still fresh in our minds, how can we separate reality from overblown media reporting?

Over the last couple of months, several states have reported increased cases of Canine Infectious Respiratory Disease Complex (what we loosely call kennel cough). Severity ranges from mild to moderate kennel cough signs to severe pneumonia, often non responsive to antibiot-

ics. Laboratory testing including cultures and PCR have failed to find the causative agent triggering the so called "mystery" organism. It is not due to canine influenza as affected pets

have tested negative on PCR. Many states have reported multiple cases including Oregon, Colorado and New Hampshire; officials are

working with state and federal veterinary diagnostic labs to determine the underlying cause. In addi-

tion, a respiratory outbreak at the San Diego Humane Society simultaneously hit the news further muddling the information. That outbreak,

however, was found to be caused by a bacteria called Streptococcus equi zooepidemicus and was not

related to the other reported cases across the nation.

in the nation. Although some veterinarians in the San Fernando Valley have reported similar cases to

the LA Dept. Of Veterinary Public Health, we, at VCA McClave Animal Hospital, have not seen an increase in respiratory diseases in dogs to date and have not needed to sound any


alarm. As for the mystery "bug" researchers have pointed out that being unable to find a causative agent to an illness is not that uncommon and does not necessary point out to a new unrecognized organism.

What can you do to protect your dogs? Above all, do not panic and refer to your veterinarian and not to social media for updated information. Furthermore, make sure that all dogs who board, attend doggy day care and local parks are up-to-date on the Bordetella and Influenza vaccines and report any respiratory symptoms to your veterinarian.


