Revised July 29, 2020

Committee members in attendance: No roll call.

Co-chair Bob Brostoff called the meeting to order at 6:35 PM. A quorum was established.

The May 29, 2020 minutes were approved as amended. The June 16, 2020 minutes were approved.

Numbers refer to agenda items.

4. Comments from the Co-Chairs: Carolyn said as of the June MER there are \$9700 available for rollover. Budget requests were received from every committee except Government Relations (missed deadline). With all requests the WHNC is 31.96% over-budget.

5. Public Comment on Non-Agenda items: None

New Business:

6. Discussion and possible action on approving amendments to the Budget Committee Operating Rules: The Operating Rules were approved unanimously.

7. Discussion and possible action on approving a request for the Beautification Committee for fiscal year 2020-2021 in the amount of \$1,500.00: Faye and Brad, co-chairs, agreed to reduce the request to \$200.

8. Discussion and possible action on approving a request for the Education Committee for fiscal year 2020-2021 in the amount of \$7,000.00: Aida, chair, agreed to lower the request to \$4050. Nine schools at \$450 each.

9. Discussion and possible action on approving a request for the Special Events Committee for fiscal year 2020-2021 in the amount of \$7,500.00: Myrl and Steve, co-chairs, agreed to reduce the request to \$5000.

10. Discussion and possible action on approving a request for the Streets and Transportation Committee for fiscal year 2020-2021 in the amount of \$1,800.00: Accepted 31.96% reduction to \$1,224.65.

11. Discussion and possible action on approving a request for the Homelessness Committee for fiscal year 2020-2021 in the amount of \$2,250.00: Accepted 31.96% reduction to \$1,530.81.

12. Discussion and possible action on approving a request for the Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness Committee in the amount not to exceed \$150.00: Bob and Saif, co-chairs, agreed to lower the request to \$38. This was then negotiated up to \$140.05. (They agreed to whatever amount remained after all reductions to remain within the budget limit.)

13. Discussion and possible action on approving a request for Communications and Outreach Committee in the amount of \$3,700.00: Accepted 31.96% reduction to \$2,517.33.

14. Discussion and possible action on approving a request for the Ad Hoc Election Committee for fiscal year 2020-2021 in the amount of \$5,000.00: Steve said the Walking Man charge is \$549.23 not \$1500. Election Committee needs \$5000 – flyer \$2500, mailing \$2000, Warner Center News ad \$200, lawn signs \$250.

This emergency and disaster preparedness fair has drawn close to 7,000 attendees as a physical event, and we expect a comparable or larger attendance at this year's virtual event. The fair benefits Neighborhood Council stakeholders and surrounding communities by increasing family and neighborhood awareness, providing education and training, and enhancing whole community disaster preparedness. This event is family-friendly, open to the public and free to attendees and exhibitors. The grant money will be used to procure supplies, services and technical support for the Valley Disaster Preparedness Fair.
