



Past efforts by the City Council to find ways to address the impacts of group home-related uses in residential neighborhoods have encountered the complexities of trying to rein in abuses while respecting not only state and federal law, but also the variety of reasons groups of unrelated adults may have for living under the same roof. As we explore how to better manage group homes, especially those run by commercial entities, these concerns, along with state and federal regulations, must be respected.

That residents of some group homes are disabled adds a layer of complexity as well. Federal and State law demand that local jurisdictions ensure the disabled are not discriminated against in housing. Indeed, housing designed specifically for certain groups is necessary for the health and well-being of the community. According to the California Research Bureau's 2016 report, "Sober Living Homes in California: Options for State and Local Regulation," sober living homes are integral to California's system of substance abuse resources. Yet no state agency formally regulates sober living homes. State laws and licensing requirements governing treatment and care facilities do not apply to sober living homes. Even at the State level, there have been more than two dozen unsuccessful attempts by the state legislature to fine-tune the state's laws regarding sober living homes since 1998.

Various jurisdictions, both within and outside California, have considered or approved local regulations governing group home related uses, aspects of which might prove applicable in Los Angeles. The City should review these efforts, including any ordinances that have been approved along with any litigation they may have engendered, and determine whether aspects of any of them could be applicable to circumstances here with regard to mitigating the impacts of group homes, including sober living homes.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Attorney and Chief Legislative Analyst be instructed to review the legislative and regulatory opportunities the City may have for mitigating the impacts of all kinds of group homes on surrounding neighborhoods and communities, including a thorough review of such efforts undertaken in other jurisdictions, and to report back to the City Council within 120 days with analysis, options and recommendations.

MOTION

During Los Angeles' March 2015 election, only one in ten eligible voters chose to submit ballots. This low voter turnout is likely due, in part, to voters' belief that they can do little to influence local elections and policies.

This belief is reinforced when developers, and others who have business before the City of Los Angeles contribute widely to political campaigns, and in some cases, flout campaign finance rules entirely. Unlike the City's ban on campaign contributions from companies seeking City contracts, no such ban currently exists for developers seeking City approvals on their potentially-lucrative projects.

Previously, legal uncertainty prevented such a ban; however, in 2004 the City of San Diego implemented a ban on donations from special interests, and this ban was upheld by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in 2011, citing the importance of the "anticorruption and anticircumvention interests" of the restrictions. This recent court decision forges the legal path for Los Angeles to move forward.

Limiting contributions from certain non-individuals can also improve election turnout. When New York City restricted contributions from some non-individual entities, its share of campaign contributions to candidates by individuals rose from 61% in 1997 to 92% in 2013, pointing toward the effectiveness of these measures in their mission to create more local elections driven by individual voters, donors, and stakeholders.

WE THEREFORE MOVE that the Los Angeles City Ethics Commission be requested to prepare an ordinance similar to the 2011 Measure H restrictions approved by the voters, to prohibit contributions to City elected officials and candidates for City office from developers and their principals with development projects currently or recently being considered for discretionary approval by the City.

WE FURTHER MOVE that the Ethics Commission, in coordination with the City Attorney and the Planning Department, be requested to report on possible options for the definition of a "developer" to ensure as wide a net as possible is cast, in addition to exploring whether contractors and subcontractors on development projects requiring discretionary council approval should be included in this ban.

WE FURTHER MOVE that the Ethics Commission be requested to report on best practices, in line with the spirit and intent of this motion, from other jurisdictions who have implemented such bans. In particular, the Metro model based on recusal from voting on contracts where the Board member has accepted monetary contributions should be examined as a possible alternative to a full ban if it proves to be a more constitutionally permissible model.

WE FURTHER MOVE that the Ethics Commission be requested to prepare an ordinance to require campaign committees to provide additional information on non-individual entity contributors, including a category that denotes contributions derived from developers and their principals.

WE FURTHER MOVE that the Ethics Commission be requested to prepare an ordinance to require a signed affidavit that requires the contributor to positively affirm, under penalty of perjury, that the contribution is being made by the contributor, that the contributor is not being reimbursed, and that the contributor does not have any open applications for discretionary approval of development projects before the city, in addition to any other city ethics laws that should be included in the affidavit.

WE FURTHER MOVE that the City Administrative Officer be instructed and the Ethics Commission be requested to report on the costs and benefits of increasing the size of enforcement staff at the Ethics Commission to increase the number of inspections and audits that can be carried out to reduce the incidences of campaign finance fraud and improve transparency, and, to report on the costs of creating an accessible and easy-to-pavigate website with front page access to the whistleblower hotline.

- We support best practices for enforcement of the new ordinance with examples being taken from other jurisdictions which have implemented such bans.
- The Ethics Commission should provide a method for additional information on contributions from non-individual entities.

MOTION

The new City Charter effective July 1, 2000 established the Neighborhood Council System, to connect government with communities, promote more citizen participation in government, and make government more responsive to local needs. As the system grew, neighborhood council representatives expressed a need for more time when addressing the City Council to fully explain their thoughts, ideas, and opinions regarding decisions to be made on issues that directly affect their communities than was provided through the standard public comment period. In response, the City Council adopted an ordinance in 2015 (C.F. 15-0389 and 15-0524), which states that the meeting chair "...may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more comment time than allotted to members of the general public." This extended time provision has proven successful in increasing the level of neighborhood council dialog during crucial policy-making decisions.

A very small handful of established community councils pre-date the City's system of Certified Neighborhood Councils -- most notably, the Pacific Palisades Community Council, founded in 1973, and the Brentwood Community Council, founded in 1998. Early on, these organizations opted not to join City's Neighborhood Council System, but they nevertheless continue to serve as the officially recognized representative bodies of Pacific Palisades and Brentwood, with a collective stakeholder population of approximately 77,000 people. These elected bodies provide the same crucial function as certified neighborhood councils -- to vet community issues and serve as official open forums for weighing-in on official City business.

In 2013, the City Council adopted a similar policy enhancement (C.F. 13-1625) by instructing the Department of City Planning to "formally begin providing the Pacific Palisades Community Council and Brentwood Community Council with the same level of notification offered to the City's certified neighborhood councils on all planning matters, including legally mandated public hearing notices." Based on this precedent and the vital representation function these all-volunteer bodies provide to the City, the same discretionary extended time allowance for Certified Neighborhood Councils should be applied to select non-certified community councils that meet specifically defined criteria.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Attorney be requested to amend Section 22.819 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code (LAAC) to include an additional time set aside provision by applying the current discretionary extended time allowance to non-certified community councils when a representative presents an official position on an item pending before a City Board or Commission, provided that the organization was formally established prior to July 1, 2000 and has remained in continuous operation, has duly elected representatives and formally adopted bylaws, serves as the preeminent representative body for an official City of Los Angeles community or neighborhood, and has clearly defined geographic boundaries that do not in any way overlap with those of existing Certified Neighborhood Councils.

The Government Relations Committee and has approved a Community Impact Statement to be added to Council File 15-0389-S1.

- Each Neighborhood Council had to submit an application and go through the process of being certified.
- There are currently 97 Certified Neighborhood Councils with several more in process.
- Each board member of a Certified Neighborhood Council had to go through an Election, Ethics Training on a bi-annual basis, Funding Training, and sign a Code of Civility in order to participate in the system.
- Additionally, all Board and Committee meetings of each Neighborhood Council are subject to the Brown Act.
- The Community Councils have chosen not to participate in the Neighborhood Council System and be subjected to those rules and regulations.

We therefore recommend that those Community Councils that are not part of the Neighborhood Council system not be given the additional time to 5 minutes and be limited to the standard 2 minutes during public comment.
