SB 411 Updates: If a Neighborhood Council has a quorum of board members in a physical location, board members who wish to join the meeting via teleconferencing must adhere to AB 2449 rules and regulations. If a Neighborhood Council does not have a quorum of board members in a physical location, they must adhere to SB 411 rules and regulations. In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph, provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.(ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.

<u>Public Input</u>: Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to 2 minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

LAFD Battalion Chief Mike Flynn introduced Task Force 105 from fire station 105. He spoke about the 16th Annual Grateful Hearts Event honoring our local LAPD and LAFD, Sunday Nov. 9, 2025, from 9 AM - 3PM --21555 Oxnard Street Woodland Hills (site of the future Rams Village at Warner Center). There was a recent fire at 21720 Hart Street. It started in the garage of a three storey condo, and the cause was lithium ion batteries. There was an auto fire at 6250 Canoga. He gave a reminder for Halloween safety. Captain Ho from fire station 105 said their doors are always open and invited the public to stop by for a tour.

Announcements:

Solen Ronarch, Field Representative, 46th State Assembly District, said they are having a student debt webinar on October 27 at 6 PM. The annual Holiday Toy Drive is November 16 from 8-4. The Governor signed two of Assemblymember Gabriel's bills: AB1264 to remove harmful additives from school lunches, and AB592 to ease requirements for outdoor dining permits. Assemblymember Gabriel declined to vote on SB79.

Ron Rubine, Senior Advisor, CD12, introduced Tim Kartiala. He is the new CD12 Building and Safety staff person, and will be the WHNC contact. The Drive-in Movie Night is sold out. Mr. Kartiala gave some of his background. He previously worked in the entertainment industry.

Vincent Autiero, Neighborhood Empowerment Advocate, DONE, said Civics U is coming up but has been changed to a virtual meeting. Now all Board members may attend. It is this Saturday from 9-12. The City Clerk has upcoming funding workshops: Contracts; Oct. 9, 2-3:30 PM and Oct. 23, 6-7:30 PM -- System Portal; Oct. 14, 2-4 PM and Oct.28, 6-8 PM. If anyone wants help with outreach using Nextdoor or Canva, reach out to Marilu Guevara. Candidate forum and Board structure change information will be sent out. SB707 was signed by the Governor. This is a teleconferencing bill that extends the provisions on SB411 for four years.

Daniell Vicente, Field Representative, LA County Supervisorial District 3, said their office will help with any election issues. The grant application process for non-profits is changing. LA County is the most disaster prone area in the nation. On Nov. 1, from 10 AM - 1 PM, there will be a disaster preparedness fair at the Calabasas Community Center. The supervisors are exploring an eviction moratorium.
