**SB707 Updates:** In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(3).

The legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(4). Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(5).

A legislative body that provides a time public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to paragraph (5), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(A).

A legislative body that does not provide a time public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to paragraph (5), or otherwise to be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(B).

**Public Input:** Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, an issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to two minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the committee.



RESOLUTION

RULES, ELECTIONS, INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS

**WHEREAS**, any official position of the City of Los Angeles with respect to legislation, rules, regulations, or policies proposed to or pending before a local, state, or federal government body or agency must have first been adopted in the form of a Resolution by the City Council; and

**WHEREAS**, across California law enforcement agencies, training standards for enforcing driving under the influence (DUI) laws vary widely, leaving many traffic officers without advanced or consistent instruction in impaired driving detection; and

**WHEREAS**, over the past decade, alcohol-related deaths in California have surged by more than 50 percent, a rate of increase more than twice as steep as the national average, reflecting a serious and worsening public safety crisis on the state’s roads; and

**WHEREAS**, drug-impaired driving has also risen sharply alongside alcohol-related offenses, with law enforcement agencies reporting more positive drug tests after deadly accidents, creating a more complex impairment landscape that officers must be equipped to identify and handle; and

**WHEREAS**, injuries caused by impaired drivers in Los Angeles County have risen every year for the last decade, with DUI cases growing increasingly complex—requiring specialized, up-to-date training in the science, law, and investigative techniques necessary for officers to successfully investigate and build prosecutable cases; and


**WHEREAS**, currently pending in the State Assembly is a bill, AB 1814 (Alanis), which would require specified peace officers assigned primarily to traffic enforcement to complete a National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (NHTSA)-approved standard field sobriety testing (FST) course within one year of assignment to traffic enforcement; and

**WHEREAS**, AB 1814 seeks to improve law enforcement training surrounding the detection and enforcement of impaired driving with the hope that this this may help remedy the reduced enforcement of DUI laws; and

**WHEREAS**, policies that strengthen deterrence, improve accountability, and reduce impaired driving directly support officers’ core mission to protect the public, save lives, and prevent families from experiencing entirely avoidable loss.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that by the adoption of this Resolution, the City of Los Angeles hereby includes in its 2025-2026 State Legislative Program support of AB 1814 (Alanis), which would require a peace officer with a rank of supervisor or below who is assigned primarily to traffic enforcement to complete a National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (NHTSA)-approved standard field sobriety testing (FST) course of a minimum of 16 hours within one year of their assignment to traffic enforcement, which would ensure officers are proficient in the areas of sobriety testing and report writing.
